## Alumnus Diego Alejandro Ramos Shares a Digital Engagement Strategy for Success



Having worked as the brand manager of the second biggest alcohol company in his native Colombia for five years, **Diego Alejandro Ramos** wanted to advance his career. To start, he turned to a friend who had attended a Canadian college for advice. When she immediately mentioned Centennial College's range of advertising and marketing programs, Diego, armed with his advertising educational background and work experience, jumped into the research process. Diego says that while digital marketing's constant evolution requires practitioners to be committed a never-ending learning process, he still employs skills he gained at Centennial.

“From content creation and learning to understanding and using Google Ads and Google Analytics, the tools I received from Centennial prepared me for the challenge of starting my career and I took it on confidently,” he says. “Centennial gave me the opportunity to be part of the Canadian workforce and without the College, I wouldn't have reached the goals I've reached now.”

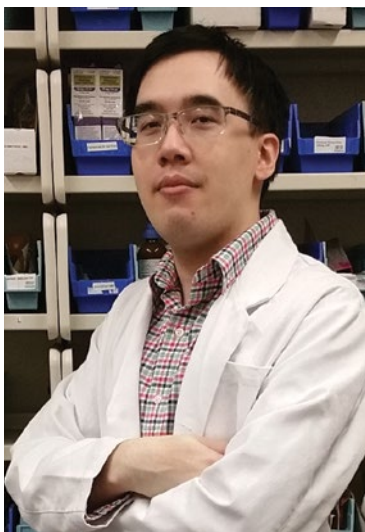

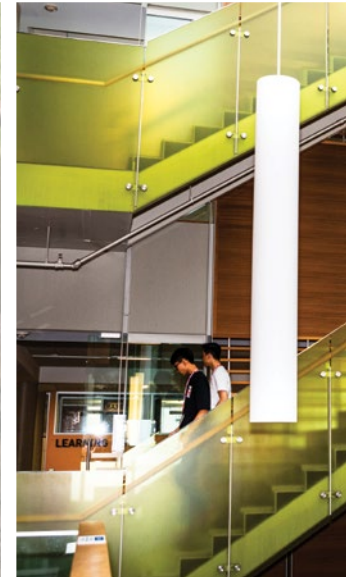

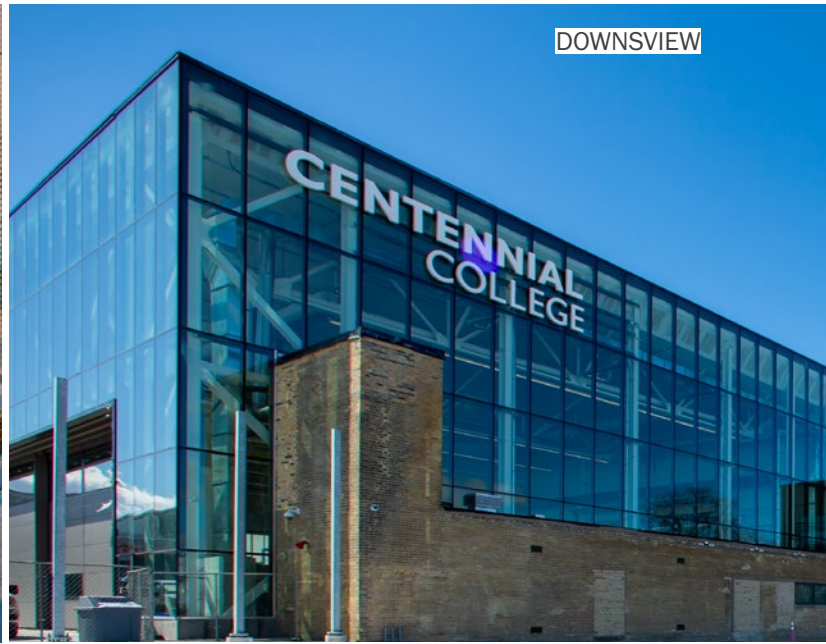
